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## Introduction

At Foxhole Learning Academy, children are expected to wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours unless otherwise agreed. Our policy has been developed in consultation with our school community and takes into account the Department for Education's [Cost of School Uniforms](#) guidance

## Aims and objectives

As a school community we believe that our school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride and respect throughout our school
- creates a sense of community and belonging
- is practical, smart and affordable for all
- identifies the children belonging to our school
- is comfortable and not distracting from school activities
- has been designed with health and safety in mind

## Uniform

- Black or grey school trousers, shorts, skirt, or pinafore dress (no jeans, leggings or casual bottoms)
- White polo shirt (with or without the school logo)
- Navy blue sweatshirt / cardigan (with or without the school logo)
- Blue and white gingham dress can be worn in the summer term through to October half-term
- Black/grey/white socks
- Black/grey tights

## Footwear

Flat black sensible shoes with toes and heels enclosed. Plain black trainers are allowed if they do not have coloured logos, soles or laces as these distract from the overall smart appearance of the uniform.

## PE (Physical Education)

- Plain black shorts, jogging bottoms or leggings
- Plain white T-shirt (with or without the school logo)



- Trainers - These do not need to be black, although if children wear black trainers to school, they can also wear these for PE. No plimsolls please as these do not offer adequate foot and ankle support, particularly for outdoor sports.

PE kits should be kept in school and will be sent home for washing half termly or more frequently for KS2 children and in the summer months. We recognise that children may not have more than one pair of trainers, so if children need their trainers to wear outside of school, they should take them home as needed. Please remember to bring them back in for their PE days in school.

Bookbags and PE bags are available to purchase from our uniform provider if these are required.

### **Jewellery**

To support the health and safety of all children, we ask that jewellery and fashion accessories are not worn to school. The only exceptions are small stud earrings and a watch.

If other items are worn, children will be asked to remove them, and the class teacher will keep them safely until the end of the school day.



For earrings other than studs, if they are not easily removable and staff feel they may pose a risk (for example, of getting caught during play or PE), they may need to be taped. In these cases, we will ask parents to ensure such items are not worn in future.

### **Hair**

Hair that is longer than shoulder length should be tied back. This helps to prevent the spread of headlice and ensures that hair does not impede school related activities. Children will be asked by an adult in the school to tie their hair back if needed. Hair accessories should be simple and for the purpose of securing hair rather than as a fashion accessory.

### **Equal Opportunities**

Foxhole Learning Academy is an inclusive school and warmly welcomes children with differing needs, from all backgrounds and faith communities. We will consider all reasonable request made by individual families to vary our policy to accommodate religious beliefs, ethnicity, disability or any other special consideration. Any individual requests to vary our uniform policy should be made directly to the Headteacher.

### **Help with the cost of uniform**

Our school uniform policy has been developed to ensure that our uniform is accessible to all our families, and for this reason we do not insist on jumpers and cardigans with the embroidered school logo. This enables parents to purchase school items at competitive prices. As a school we also aim to keep a limited stock of preowned items which parents can access free of charge through our 'Jumper Swap Shop.'

### **The Role of Parents**

We kindly ask all parents and carers to support our school uniform policy and send their children into school correctly dressed and ready for their learning. Parents should ensure that their child has the correct uniform and that this is clearly labelled with their name. Please encourage your child, particularly as they get older to take responsibility for their own belongings in school such as jumper, water bottles and packed lunch boxes.

If children attend school without the appropriate uniform as outlined in this policy, we will bring this to the attention of parents/carers. We may also discuss this the child, but this will always be done sensitively and appropriate to their age and understanding.

### **The Role of Governors**



The Local Governing Body supports the Headteacher in implementing the school uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding this policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity.

### **Monitoring and Review**

When monitoring this policy, the Local Governing Body will:

- seek the views of parents, to be sure that they agree with the policy, and support it
- consider with the Headteacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensations

require the Headteacher to report to the Governors on the way in which the policy is being implemented.
