Local Governing Body Impact Assessment – Academic Year 22/23

What were our objectives?

- To ensure clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.
- Holding the Headteacher and SLT to account, for the educational performance of the school and the application of due diligence in respect of the School Improvement Plan.
- To ensure appropriate fiscal management, maximising availability of learning material and content for our children.
- To actively pursue an improvement in OFSTED rating at the next assessment.
- To maximise the use of recovery funding to the advantage of all school children

How have we achieved our objectives?

- We've returned to face to face meetings as governors of the school.
- Fortnightly discussions between the Headteacher and Chair/Vice Chair of Governors have a wider agenda.
- We have ensured that all interventions have a measurable and assured impact.
- The LGB has reviewed, and where appropriate, commented on policies pertinent to the school and trust.
- We have reviewed assessments and moderation to ensure that age related expectations are within or exceeding government guidelines.
- The LGB has continued to review spending plans and has ensured that appropriation of funds is in line with the wider school improvement plan.
- The LGB has consistently reviewed risks and supported mitigation plans where necessary.

• All LGB meetings have successfully recorded impacts that are being made across the school.

What outcomes have we achieved?

- Progress?
- Monitoring visits have returned to the classroom and have captured evidence demonstrating that planned change has been implemented.
- Reviews of the effectiveness of middle leadership has supported information to underpin the OFSTED inspection.
- Self-assessment and external audit has indicated a positive shift in the quality of governance.
- Safeguarding has been recorded as effective and inline with expectation, with some areas exceeding the requirement.
- Risk mitigation has been implemented where required to effectively manage staff attrition.
- Funding allocations for recovery funding, sports premium and SEN provision have all been committed appropriately and have maximised efficiency.

- What other things have we done?
- There has been ongoing concern about the Requires Improvement determination from the 2019 OFSTED inspection. The school was subject to a review in early 2023 and with the outcome of GOOD being formally recorded, the OFSTED rating is now much improved. This is assured by better school practices.
- Face to face and community engagement needs to be improved. Since the lifting of COVID 19 constraints, the school has returned to almost normal operating. With several key engagements now re-appearing on the calendar, with a notable success from FOSCA and the recent fayres.



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
