



#### **Background**

The Primary PE and Sport Premium is funding provided directly to **primary school Headteachers** to improve the **quality and depth of PE and school sport provision**. The aim is to support schools in building sustainable improvements that benefit **all pupils**, now and in the future.

#### Vision

The Department for Education's vision is that all pupils leave primary school physically literate, with the knowledge, skills, and motivation needed to lead healthy, active lives and participate in lifelong physical activity and sport.

### Objective

The objective of the funding is to achieve **self-sustaining improvement** in the quality of PE and sport in schools by developing a **balanced and holistic offer**.

#### **Key Indicators for Improvement**

Schools should aim to demonstrate improvement across the following **five key indicators**:

- 1. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
  - o Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend at least 60 minutes of daily physical activity for children aged 5–18, with 30 minutes delivered during the school day.
- 2. Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school
  - o Used as a tool to drive whole-school improvement.





- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff
  - Ensuring high-quality teaching of PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities
  - Offered to all pupils to support wider engagement.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport
  - o Encouraging more pupils to represent the school and engage in healthy competition.

### **Funding Allocation**

Each school will receive approximately £16,000—£18,000 per annum, depending on the number of pupils on roll. This funding can be used to support the above outcomes through a variety of strategies, including:

- Continuing professional development (CPD) for staff
- Employing PE specialists or coaches to work alongside teachers
- Collaborating in clusters or partnerships with other schools
- Purchasing equipment or hiring facilities (e.g., halls, pools)
- Providing transport to competitions or events

#### Accountability & Impact -

#### Schools are required to:

- Inform parents and publish a plan for how the PE and Sport Premium funding is being used.
- Track pupil progress to demonstrate the impact and improvements made through the use of the funding.
- Show evidence of impact, as this will be assessed by Ofsted when judging the quality of leadership and management.

### Key Deadlines for 2024/25:

- By 31 March 2025: Schools must publish all PE and Sport Premium spend carried over from the academic year 2024/25 on their website.
- By 31 July 2025: Schools must publish their end-of-year report on their website.
- Optional: By 9 July 2025: Schools may submit their report to Active Cornwall for feedback ahead of the Government deadline.

Time 2 Move - 'Time2Move' is the Cornwall Framework for PE and School Sport.
