Introduction

It is our policy that all children should wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. Our policy has been developed taking into account the Department for Education's <u>Cost of School Uniforms</u> guidance.

Aims and objectives

Our policy is based on the notion that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- engenders a feeling of community and belonging;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;
- is not distracting in class;
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.

Our School Uniform Comprises of

Grey/Black trousers, shorts, or skirt
White Polo Shirt
Navy Blue Sweatshirt/Cardigan
Navy Blue Pinafore Dress
Red and White check dress (Summer)
Red/Navy tights
Grey/black/White socks
Sun hats/caps are encouraged to be worn at playtime.

Footwear

Black sensible, functional shoes or black trainers - No flashing lights please.

Physical Education

Black shorts and white T-shirt – Elasticated black plimsolls or trainers. Blue PE Hoodie.


Outdoor P.E during the winter

Plimsolls or Sports Trainers.

P.E kit should be kept in school and taken home at half term. PE kits can be taken home outside of half term upon request.

All children need a draw string P.E bag and a book bag.





We would ask that when selecting garments please avoid "complicated" styles and fastenings. Remember that children have to dress and undress themselves at school. Please mark all clothing with the child's name.

Pre-loved Uniform

When available, we will offer pre-loved uniform from school. This will be advertised in advance on Class Dojo and email.

Jewellery

On health and safety grounds, we do not allow children to wear jewellery in school. The exceptions to this rule are studs in pierced ears, and small objects of religious significance, such as a crucifix on a chain. We ask the children either to remove these objects during PE and games, or to cover them with a plaster.

Hair, Make-up and Nail Varnish

We ask that hair is of a natural colour and for long hair to be tied back sensibly, so as not to hinder the child during the school day. We also ask that children do not wear make-up or nail varnish to school. Strictly **no** large bows or novelty headbands e.g. with ears/Unicorns – they are a real distraction to your own child's learning as well as others – we request that they are saved for parties and dress-up days!

Footwear

The school wants all children to grow into healthy adults. We believe that it is dangerous for children to wear shoes with platform soles or high heels in school, so we do not allow this. We require all children to wear the types of shoe described in the uniform list.

The Role of Parents

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and

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ready for their daily schoolwork. Parents should ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean and in good repair.

If any parent is struggling to follow the uniform policy, they should talk to the school in the first instance.

Equal Opportunities

The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, e.g. religious objections, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, the school will look individually at such requests. Similarly, should an item of school uniform prove problematic for a pupil with disabilities, then parents are invited to draw this to the attention of the Headteacher. The school will not treat pupils with disabilities unfavourably.

The Role of Governors

The Local Governing Board supports the Headteacher in implementing the school uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding this policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity.

Monitoring and Review

When monitoring this policy, the Local Governing Board will:

- seek the views of parents, to be sure that they agree with the policy, and support it;
- consider with the Headteacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensations;
- require the Headteacher to report to the Governors on the way in which the policy is being implemented.
