It was lovely to start the year with no treat of Covid for the first time in 2 years and lovely sense of normality resumed.

Our focus was on the school's improvement plan, especially with OFSTED looming. This is largely based on our KS2 SAT results and really focuses on area to improve on.

We were delighted to welcome Rebecca Lobb as our staff governor this year, whilst Sadie Robinson is on Maternity leave.

We also welcomed new Parent governor Sam Hebburn, Sam brings a wealth of teaching experience and will be a valuable new member of the team.

Monies received from the Catch-up grant and the National Tutoring programs has been used to enhance Pupil premium, sports premium and SEND grants further. We have been able to again continue to target pupils who need extra boosts across numerous subject due to missed and disrupted learning, this had quite an impact with SATs last year and we were hopeful this would have the same outcomes.

Monies were also invested in Swimming lessons resuming, new playground equipment, refreshing PE equipment and a new climbing frame for KS1, with helps from FOTS.

I attended a SATS monitoring visit in May and noticed how calm and positive the children all were, the booster sessions and catch-up tuition obviously had an incredible impact on their learning. This was evident in the absolutely incredible SATS results, they were well above national average, with Reading being 92%! The structured plan and targeted intervention were extremely well devised, and the impact was clearly seen.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff for their incredible dedication and resilience they have shown this year, especially as it has been quite challenging at times. They continue to learn and evolve and strive to be the best they can be.

As we say a sad farewell to Collen Thorpe, Kaye Pitcher and Hannah Stevens I'd like to personally thank them for their year of continuing support, you will be missed a lot.
